## Conference Location

Greater Miami along with its beaches is a colorful and vibrant mecca for visitors. It's the perfect place to mix business and pleasure. Miami combines a sunny climate and multi-cultural personality with all the amenities of a sophisticated metropolitan area. Miami has a sub-tropical climate where the sun shines nearly every day of the year. The average temperature is 78°F - 85° F, with 84 miles of Atlantic Ocean coastline, 67 square miles of inland water, and one of the nation's largest wildlife preserves in the Everglades. ## Accommodation

A block of rooms has been reserved at the conference location – Turnberry Isle Miami ([www.turnberryislemiami.com/](http://www.turnberryislemiami.com/)). A room rate of \$155 per night has been negotiated for conference attendees and will also be honored for three days before and after the meeting. ## Conference Registration

All attendees are required to register for the conference. Registration will open on 1 January 2013 using the registration form available at: <https://www.awma.org/Core/Events/eventdetails.aspx?iKey=NATO2013>. Registration will not be processed without payment. Payment must be made by credit card. Refunds (less a \$35 processing fee) will be granted only for cancellations received by 1 June 2013. The registration site also allows for purchase of activity tickets for guests.

## Conference Fee

A pre-registration conference fee of \$625 covers an ITM admission badge for the week, a conference program, a USB drive containing the conference papers, the final conference proceedings, admission to all oral and poster sessions, morning and afternoon refreshment breaks, an icebreaker reception, Monday and Tuesday evening formal poster viewing sessions with heavy hors d'oeuvres, a Wednesday afternoon excursion to the Everglades (or an optional tour of Miami), and admission to the Thursday evening luau on the beach. After 15 June 2013 the conference fee will increase to \$700. After 31 July 2013 the late registration fee will be \$750.

## Abstract Submission

Abstracts (maximum of 300 words), should be submitted using instructions on [www.int-tech-mtnq.org](http://www.int-tech-mtnq.org) by **31 January 2013**.

The abstract should include:

- Title of the paper
- Name of the authors, affiliations and email addresses
- Summary of objectives, main findings and results
- Key topic
- Intention to give an oral or poster presentation

Confirmation of abstract acceptance by e-mail: April 30, 2013.
